

On Friday last a charge of a most flagitious nature was preferred before Mr. Justice BOND, at Bow-street, against a person of great notoriety in the Courts of Law.

It was sworn by two women, that they had been prevailed upon by two procureesses employed by this man to meet him separately at the Rummer public-house, Charing-cross, which he was in the habit of frequenting, and where he went by the name of Captain Jones.

The circumstances of the treatment which the evidences deposed they had received from Captain Jones, are so extremely indecent and shocking, that it is impossible, with any respect to decorum, to lay them before the public.

The case was very minutely attended to by Mr. BOND, and the *Captain* was discharged on giving bail. Mr. BUTLER DANVERS and Mr. DAVIS, commonly called *Black Davis*, were his bail.

We are extremely glad to learn of the success of the New Marine Police Establishment in Wapping, which offers so much accommodation as well as security to the merchants. It is astonishing the effect the Institution has already had, in preventing *Piracies* and *Robberies*, as well as *Ilicit Trade* on the River. In the Court of Chancery, on Tuesday, a prosecution for wilful and corrupt perjury was ordered to be instituted against *Thompson*, a Baker, lately committed to prison, for having married a Ward of the Court, by swearing she was of full age.

Monday one of the Greenwich stages was overturned near the Bricklayers Arms on the Kent Road, when the coachman was much hurt, but happily none of the passengers sustained any injury.
