

## FOREWORD.

It's all very well to say "write a foreword" but when an indefatigable compiler has carefully covered all the ground available in a brief but comprehensive introduction one is likely to be dull or draw on one's imagination.

One loophole only has he left me for enlargement and that is the inception of the idea of a private contingent and this is how it came about.

There were three of us on the Recruiting Committee of the Public Contingent George Huggins, Enrique Prada, and myself and we each had a boy of about the same age, anxious to serve.

Two of these had already departed and the incorrigible third was busy constructing a hencoop, or some such contraption, in which to embark on his own—so it was borne home to us—simultaneously I think—that there was much young blood anxious to be let, to be had for the asking and the *sending*.

The writer too had long before decided to discount his half century at 18 per cent. and unblushingly romp home with the clock put nine years back.

So putting our heads together we repaired to W.G., told him what had got to be done—and done under his auspices—to which, like a good sportsman, he promptly responded.

Thus our small barque was launched and the Dollars came tumbling in by the thousand—\$18,000, I think, within the first few days—to be multiplied later more than three times over.

Of course the incomparable George was the driving force throughout, and obstacles fell before him as flat as the walls of Jericho.

There were difficulties of various kinds and the Grand Panjandrum himself was averse to all local effort—except of a certain type—while his C.-in-C. was possessed with the weird idea that this peaceful Island was the place of all others to defend and proceeded to dig what he fondly believed were "trenches" in all sorts of impossible places.

However, the powers that were, having been kept discreetly in the dark up to a certain point, our Committee finally carried everything before it.

A worm on the Press turned at the last moment, but failed to harm and we finally sailed from the West Indies 112 as gallant a little company as one need wish to command.

Of course the majority of us was "Creole," of British or French extraction, but the inevitable Scot was there, and where is he missing when there is hard fighting to be done?

Nowhere and not for a thousand years!

On the day of our departure we were nearly killed with kindness by the assembled crowd and but for the redoubtable efforts of those small giants the Boy Scouts we should never (I verily believe) have caught our ship.

"Once on board the lugger" however, and the rest was easy.

Drill and Physical exercises morning and evening—and sports in the interval—were the order of the day and kept us fit while spirits and enthusiasm never flagged.

Off the south coast of Ireland we escaped the attentions of a German Submarine which was waiting—but which, thanks to our escort of two Destroyers thought better of it.

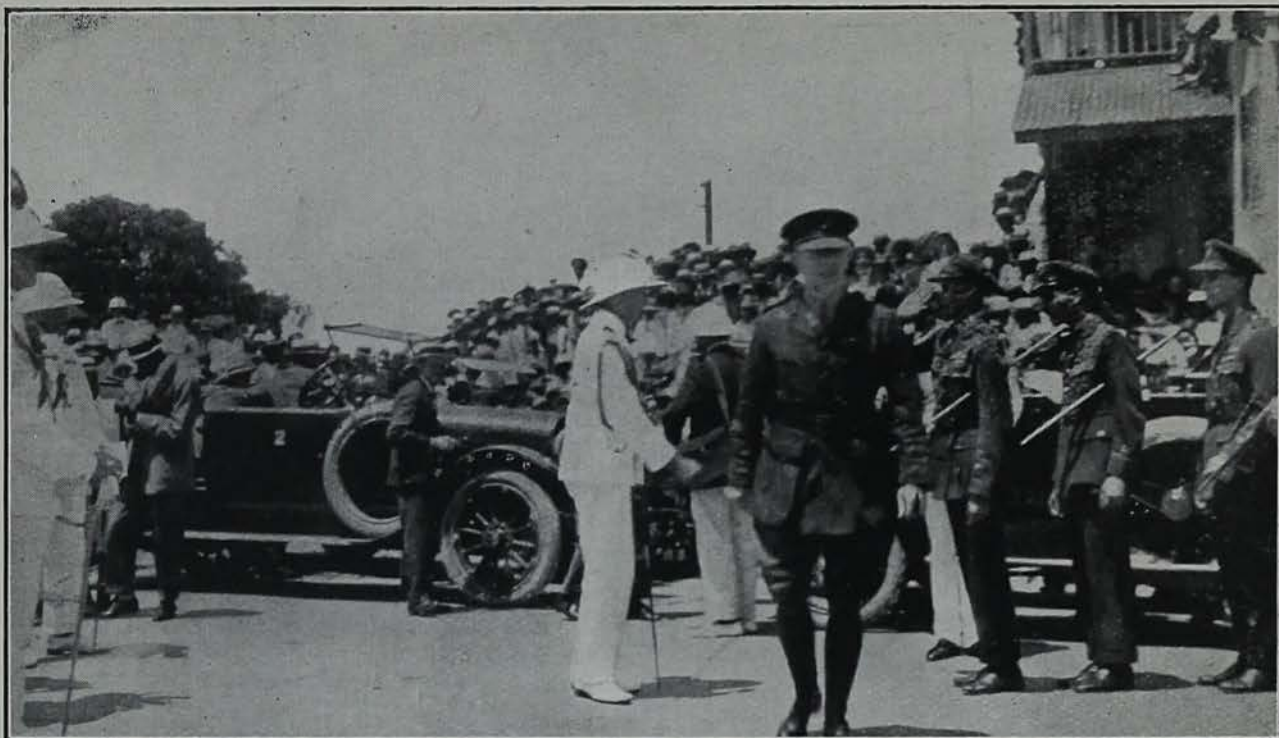

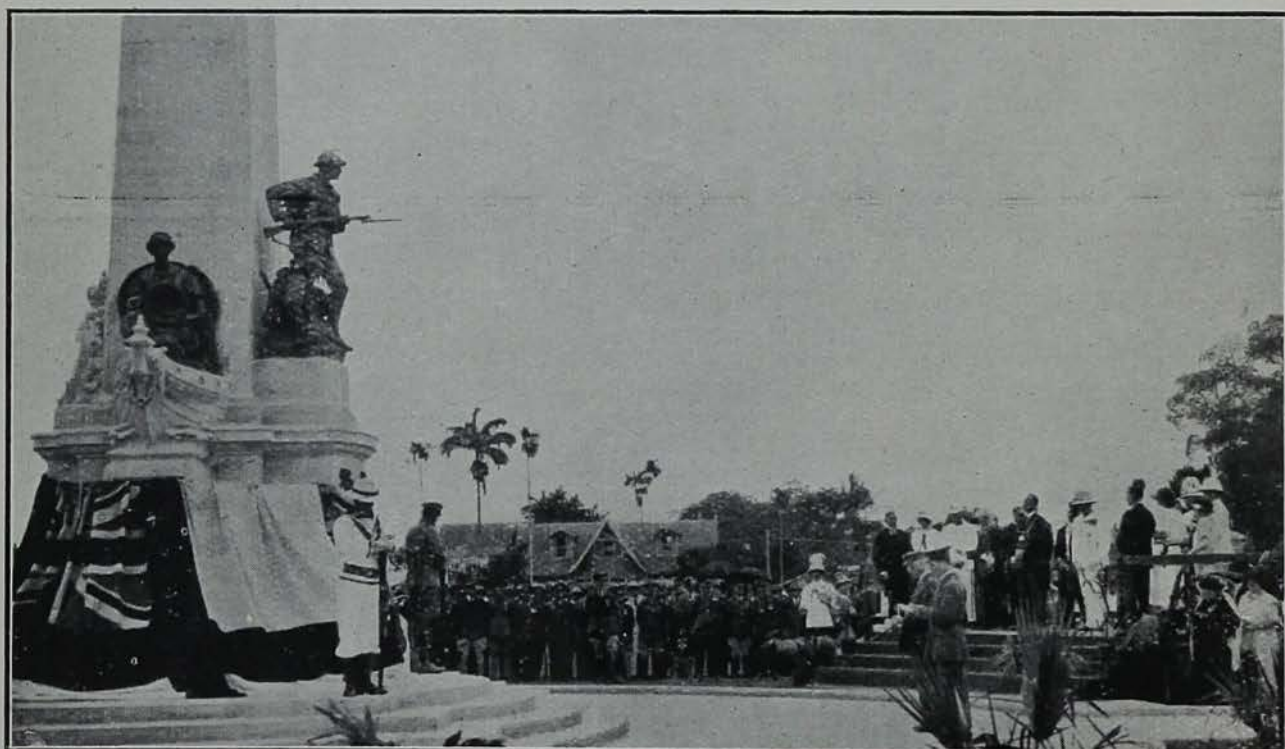
The rest of the tale is told elsewhere and my boys that were are largely scattered to the four corners of the earth—until the next war—*Vale!*

Inspection of Contingent by Prince of Wales.

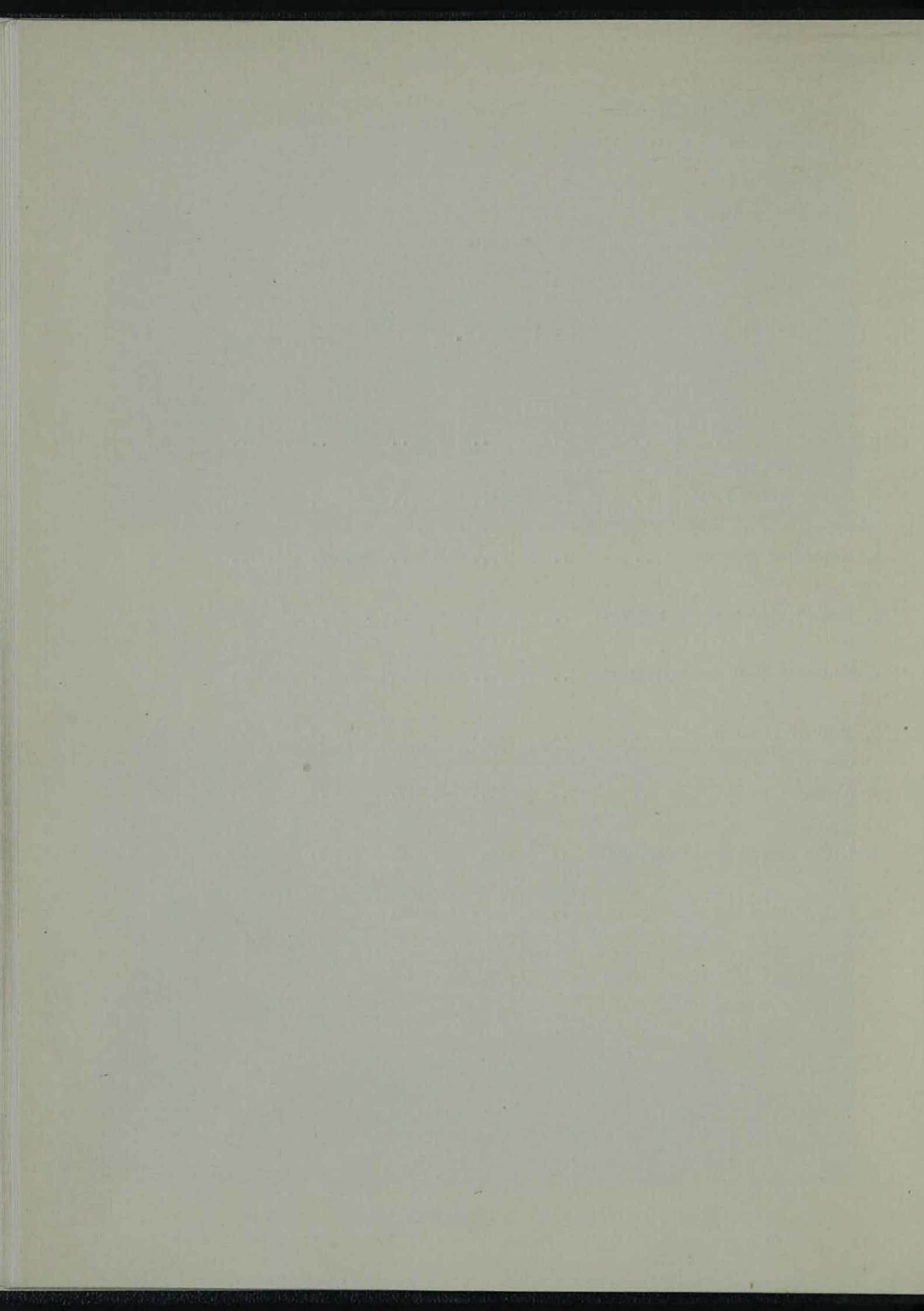


Contingent at Unveiling of War Memorial.

## INTRODUCTION.

---

This little book has been compiled as a record of the work done by the members of the Trinidad Merchants' and Planters' Contingent during the Great War.

In August, 1915, a Committee was appointed under the auspices of Mr. Wm. Gordon Gordon to organise a contingent of men who were willing to offer their services to the Mother Country.

The First Contingent was recruited in a very short space of time, and in October, 1915, 113 men who had benefited greatly by several weeks' training, left Trinidad under the Command of Major A. S. Bowen in the R.M.S. *Danube*.

It was a memorable day and one which will never be forgotten as long as we live. The Contingent landed in England on the 2nd November and were billeted at the London Central Y.M.C.A. The next day they were inspected by the Lord Mayor, Sir Charles Johnston, and were entertained at the Mansion House. Within a week the majority had been enlisted and were scattered far and wide.

The Second Contingent left Trinidad on the 29th December, 1915, under the Command of Mr. J. B. L. Todd and they also had the honour of being inspected and entertained by the then Lord Mayor, Sir Charles Wakefield. The majority of this contingent joined the 4th Battalion City of London Regiment, Royal Fusiliers, the Reserve Battalion of which was stationed at Salisbury Plain.

The Trinidadians suffering somewhat severely from the change of climate, it was decided to send them, until the weather became warmer, to the 7th Battalion Royal Fusiliers, then stationed at Falmouth.

Finally they did not return to their first regiment but were transferred to the Devonshire Regiment and sent to India.

Recruiting still continued in Trinidad and other Contingents were sent to England, the last leaving on 14th September, 1918, and arriving just too late for the men to join up.

The Merchants' and Planters' Contingent had a very creditable record. Of the 276 members who left Trinidad, 70 received commissions and in all 84 received promotion. Of the 113 members of the First Contingent 50 received commissions, a percentage of 44.

By the end of the War two members had reached the rank of Major, 8 the rank of Captain, 34 Lieutenant, 24 Second Lieutenant, 3 Sergeant, 6 Corporal, and 7 L'ce.-Corporal. The Contingent also received its fair share of rewards, 17 members receiving decorations, three of them twice, also 15 members received the greatest reward of all—a little wooden cross—and are now resting in ground that will be " forever England."

The Compiler has to thank all the members who have assisted him in his work. The majority have been very helpful, especially Major (now Lieut.-Col.) A. S. Bowen, v.d., Commander of the First Contingent, who will ever be remembered by the men as one of the very best of fellows. He was strict and he knocked discipline into us all, and I am sure we all thanked him for it.

Unbounded thanks are due to Mr. Geo. F. Huggins, O.B.E., for the part he took. He was the moving spirit in the formation of the Contingent and looked after the interests of its members both in Trinidad and in England to great purpose. For his services during the War His Majesty the King conferred on him the Order of an Officer of the British Empire.

To Mr. Algernon Aspinall, C.M.G., Secretary of the West India Committee, I am most grateful for the help he has given in the preparation of this book. The men of the different Contingents will always remember the kind welcome he extended to them on the occasion of their visits to the Committee Rooms in London. He was never too busy to spare a few minutes to every one of us.

Some of the information, and some of the Photographs, have been taken from Franklin's Year Book, 1919 edition, and for the use of them I must thank Mr. C. B. Franklin.

I have also to thank His Excellency, the Acting Governor and the Executive for allowing this book to be printed at the Government Printing Office.

Thanks are also due to Mr. A. L. Rhodes, the Government Printer, for the great interest he has taken in the printing and publication of the Record.

The subscribers to the Fund numbered 204 and the total amount subscribed was \$61,433.38.

I am sure this little book will bring back to us all memories both grave and gay, and I hope that it may be the means of bringing us together once again, and that if possible some sort of annual reunion may be organised.
