# RULES

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## VICTORIA LEAGUE RENOWN CLUB

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1. That the Club be known as the Victoria League Renown Club.
2. That Membership of the Victoria League does not include Membership of the Renown Club.
3. All applications for Membership must be made to the Committee through Miss Zona Facey, Hon. Sec. at Cross Roads, P.O.
4. Subscription to be 1/- per annum, in addition to the ordinary subscription to the Victoria League, which is at present fixed at 2/6.
5. Admission to the Club room will be by Membership Cards only. For Non-members, a special card is issued by the Committee through the Secretary. These are coloured and vary on each occasion.



6. Each Club Member undertakes to raise funds every year, towards the expenses of the Club.
7. This Club holds itself responsible for all Expenses incurred in the Entertainment of Naval Guests.
8. The Club Room is EXCLUSIVELY for the use of Men in NAVAL UNIFORM.
9. The Number of Dancing Members is fixed at 80.
10. Any Balance of Funds will be credited to the Renown Club. The Hon. Treasurer of the Victoria League may be asked to advance funds from time to time, which will be repaid by the Club Committee.

The Victoria League is a Non-Party Association of British men and women, founded in April 1901, in memory of Her Majesty the late Queen Victoria, for the purpose of promoting closer union between British subjects living in different parts of the world.

This League, in Jamaica, has the same aims, and works for the same ends as the parent League.

Management is vested in an Executive Committee, consisting of a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, ten elected members, an Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Auditor and a General Organising Secretary.

All elections are held at the Annual General Meeting.

Each Sectional Committee has its own Chairman and Secretaries all being subordinate to the General Executive.
