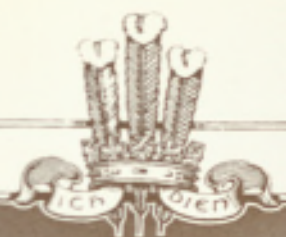

11.0 a.m.


THE STADIUM—ENTRANCE AND TERRACE
